Our FARM is phenomenal! We have a variety of animals, which include five chickens, a pig, four goats, two sheep and two ducks.


We believe our farm can help everyone as it helps us all calm down and gives everyone something to look after (nurture). It also has education purposes, which is why it is used for our curriculum.

Now the limited mode is up to no good. Hit the ball as many times as possible with more lightning strikes.


