Our Curriculum

We follow the National Curriculum, which forms the backbone of our school curriculum. Children learn best when they enjoy what they are doing. We believe in enriching and supporting learning through first hand and practical experiences. We use our knowledge of how we learn to ensure that excellence is achieved through enjoyment. Active involvement leads children to become independent and creative so high standards are achieved. The curriculum is purposely planned to be exciting and challenging so that all children have the opportunity to reach their full potential in a wide range of curriculum areas. Educational visits and visitors into school enrich and develop the children's understanding of the work we cover. In addition to this, we give the children opportunities to be enterprising through real life scenarios and through a variety of key curriculum initiatives e.g. Forest School; Film, Farm, Fork; Guitar lessons, our farm and Rights Respect.

To further support our curriculum we offer a wide range of free before and after school activities, which include many different sporting activities and art opportunities.



Our School Farm

Our children wanted to develop our grounds. They wanted to grow their own produce, plant an orchard and look after animals. Therefore, we now have three mini orchards, two goats, eight chickens, two sheep, two ducks, allotment areas, compost area and a polytunnel. The children are at the heart of all of this and they have been involved in every aspect e.g. building compost areas, building duck enclosure, looking after the animals.



Forest School

The philosophy of Forest School is to encourage and inspire individuals of any age through positive outdoor experiences. Spending time in a woodland environment has a great positive influence on health, wellbeing and personal development.

By engaging in, motivating and participating in achievable tasks and activities in a woodland environment each child has an opportunity to develop intrinsic motivation, sound emotional and social skills. These, through self-awareness, can be developed to reach personal potential.



Petworth CofE Primary School is a voluntary controlled school, which means that it was originally founded by the Church of England but chose to come under the control of the Local Authority (LA) after

the 1944 Education Act. Our school maintains its links with St. Mary's Church in Petworth by having two Foundation Governors, who are nominated by the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and appointed by the Diocesan Board of Education.

Our school is extremely well resourced and comprises of nine classrooms, an ICT suite, class set of laptops, Chromebooks, tablets, a library, five group rooms, a resources room, music room and a well resourced hall. The outside area consists of a large playing field, two playground areas, climbing frame, trim trail, Early Years area, a reflective area, storytelling area, a stage, new allotments, animals and an environmental area.



Sport plays an integral part of our curriculum and extra-curriculum. We participate in a wide range of sports e.g. netball, hockey, cricket and cross country. We have participated in various football tournaments including at Brighton Football Club's training ground. **French** is taught, to KS2 children, by our specialist teacher. Also, every child in Key Stage Two will learn to play the **guitar** for one term per academic year. Hopefully after four years they will be writing their own music.

We have a close collaboration between Midhurst Rother College and ourselves. The children in Key Stage Two regularly participate in science, maths and sporting events at the college.

We like to draw on the skills and experience of local people, organisations, and to visit places to support interesting and relevant learning activities. We actively participate in local events as we believe our school should be at the heart of the community.



ADMISSIONS

Admissions Policy

Children whose fifth birthday is between 1st September and 28th/29th February, start school full time in September.

Children whose fifth birthday is between 1st March and 31st August, can start school part time in September and attend full time from January.

If parents wish, their child can start full time in September, which we fully support.

Parents are contacted direct by West Sussex County Council's Admissions Office with details how to apply online for a school place, during the October preceding the year your child starts school. All admissions are dealt with by West Sussex County Council Admissions Department, www.westsussex.gov.uk/admissions, which contains all current admission arrangements and information for parents on how to apply on-line.

Parents wishing to visit our school are invited to telephone for an appointment with the Headteacher, who will be pleased to give them a guided tour of the school and answer any questions they may have. Visitors are encouraged to talk to staff and pupils.

We offer school places to children in the September following their fourth birthday.

We try to make sure our youngest children, and their parents, have a smooth introduction to school life. Our induction procedure includes parents' meetings, home visits, open evenings for parents and children; visits to pre-schools and nurseries by staff members and preliminary visits to school for the children. Full details are given to parents of new children during our New Parents Evening before they start school.



The Early Years Foundation Stage

The EYFS curriculum is divided into seven areas of learning, three prime and four specific. In



Through our excellent transition structure and the way we incorporate the children's ideas into the curriculum, the children are very quick in to the stride of school life. The emphasis is placed on the children choosing their activities and self initiated exploring and learning.

We use an assessment tool (Tapestry), which keeps parents and carers informed about their child's progress.

School Organisation

Petworth CofE Primary School has 172 children on our school roll, which means we have a **single class for each year group**. We believe that for children to fully engage in the National Curriculum and for children to reach their full potential that children should be taught in same aged classes.

The School Day

The school day at Petworth CofE Primary School is made up of four teaching sessions, a Collective Worship and two registrations. The school gates open at 8.30am and the day begins at 8.40am when registration will begin, so we ask that all pupils are ready to start school at this time.

Wrap-around provision

At Petworth CofE Primary School we are aware that some families may require an extension to the normal school day. We work closely with the adjoining Wakoos Nursery (<http://www.wakoosc4c.co.uk/petworth/>), who offer both breakfast and after school club provision aimed at supporting our families.



Petworth CofE Primary School and the Community

The partnership between home and school is one of the many things that makes our school special. Parents and carers are important to us and we have a strong commitment to developing links between home and school. By working closely with parents and the local community we ensure that your children have an excellent start to their education. We highly value the support that parents, carers and grandparents give and they are welcomed into the school to share their expertise and help in the classrooms. As well as providing curriculum support, the Petworth Primary School Association (PPSA) work tirelessly to put on social events and organise fundraising activities.

Pupils, teachers, parents and governors take part in local events such as Remembrance Sunday Church Service, Remembrance of the bombing of Petworth Boy's School (29th September) and the giving of harvest gifts to various charities associated with the Church. Children sing at Petworth's Fete in the Park and Petworth Fair in July and November respectively as well as occasionally running the Farmer's Market café.

The children are encouraged to involve themselves in the community and have taken part in Petworth in Bloom, where we worked with Petworth Gardeners and were filmed by the BBC. The children also take part in the annual Petworth Festival Service in St Mary's Church. At Christmas a number of children visit Rotherlea and Petworth Cottage Nursing Home to sing carols.

We have developed a link with Christ Church Streatham CofE Primary School in London. Through this link we are able to share the uniqueness of our school with the children in London, whilst at the same time learning about their customs, cultures and heritage.

We have an Educational Group Membership for Petworth House, which means that the children may be taken to the House to gain first hand experience at the many events which take place there at no charge to parents.

We embrace all the valuable resources in Petworth and our surrounding community, to give our children many opportunities to enrich their learning and extend beyond the national curriculum.
