The children were able to spin wool, grind herbs and wheat to make flour, make mosaics using tesselae and investigate primary sources using some focus questions. After lunch, we watched a introductory video which told us about the history of the palace and its significance. Then we were able to explore the museum and the gardens. The floor mosaics were so impressive and we particularly enjoyed seeing the hypocaust (under-floor heating) and the Roman coins.
