The children explored the church with Father Mark on Tuesday 8th October as part of their RE lesson.

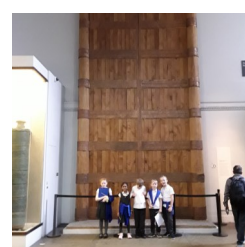


Children's Work

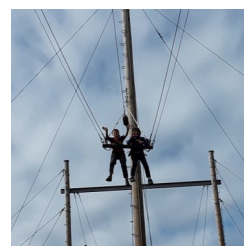
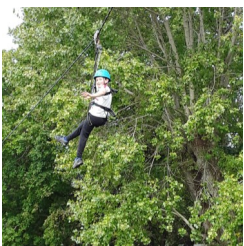
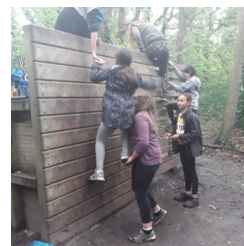
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Year 6 PGL Little Canada IOW

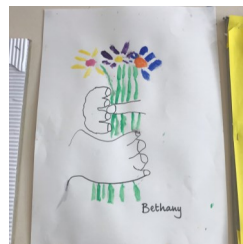


Ash Class

Year 1 have been learning to use new vocabulary such as 'more than', 'less than', 'greater' and 'fewer'. We have used the mathematical symbols to show greater and smaller groups with apparatus. We have also walked around the school, composing statements using our new words, such as "the Library has a greater number of books in it than the classroom". The children are moving on to sequencing numbers and using ordinal numbers to describe their sequences.



We have been studying the work of Picasso. After working on portraits in his style and reading "100 Picassos" and "Picasso's trousers", we created these beautiful paintings inspired by his "Bouquet of Peace".

All the children used their orienteering and map reading skills in a scavenger hunt to find artefacts hidden in the school grounds as part of their History and Geography learning.





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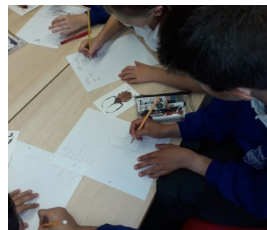
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Visit from Author M G Leonard

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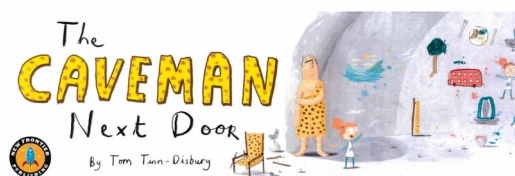

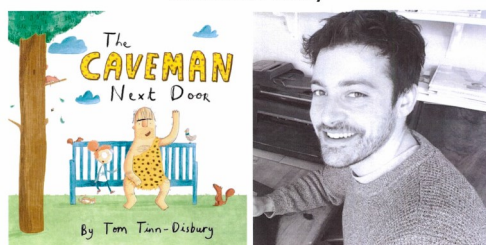
