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### UK Health Enjoy the outdoors but 'be tick aware'



Being tick aware by using the following information. can help to reduce the chance of fick bites and risk of Lyrne disease:

- ticks can transmit microbes that cause infections. auch as Lyme disease
- you could be exposed to ticks whenever you spend. time outdoors, including when in your garden or the local cark
- ticks mainly attach to animals, but sometimes they may bite you or your family.
- you can reduce the chance of tick bites by walking on clearly defined paths, using insect repellent and performing regular tick checks.
- some tick bites can result in infection, so it is important to remove ticks safely and as quickly. as possible
- the safest way to remove a tick is by using a pair of fine-tipped tweezers or a tick removal too.
- if you begin to feel unwell with flu-like symptoms, or develop a spreading circular rod rash (which usually appears within 1 to 4 weeks after being bitten), contact your GP or NHS 111 promptly. Mention if you were bitten by a tick or have recently spent time outdoors.
