Did you know that Petworth had a prison once?

Petworth House of Correction, also known as Petworth Prison, was opened in 1788 but instead of a prison, it was built to make people that refuse to work, work. The people that 'worked' there were convicted of crimes e.g. a misdemeanour (a minor wrongdoing), poaching (killing animals illegally), an assault (hurting someone) and desertion (illegally leaving the armed forces). Incredibly back then homosexuality was a crime, and they were also sent to prison.

Whilst in prison, the inmates were expected to be silent and spent some of their time in solitary confinement (when you are separated from others). One of the punishments in the prison was the treadmill (a walking wheel). It was like torture to the convicted because in the summer they had to walk ten hours a day and, in the winter, they had to walk up to seven hours per day.

Even though the prison was shut down in 1878, and demolished in 1881, you can still see a part of the prison to this day. One of the walls remains and still has the marks of the unfortunate people that were kept and punished in this prison.

During the event Petworth played four matches, winning three and losing only one game against Rose Green.


