Ecology Day in Petworth Park

On the Wednesday 26th February, all of year 5 and sixteen and year 6 children visited Petworth Park to take part in an ecology day, led by 'Nature Back from the Brink.'

The children started the day, learning about the ancient trees in Petworth Park, most notably an old English Oak, which they estimate to have been at the park for over 900 years. They then thought about the history this tree would have seen, and learnt more about how Petworth Park came to be part of the landscape and the changes that had occurred, after it was given to the current family from Henry VIII.

Following on from this, the children split into two groups. One group went to work with Laura, looking at the tree as a habitat. They found out that many insect species rely on the trees in Petworth Park to survive and that also special types of lichen and fungi can be found on these trees. They then had the opportunity to use natural materials such as; charcoal, mud, grass and moss to create their own nature booklets, sketching and shading some of the insects and tress they could see. While doing this activity some of the children found owl pellets, which led us to believe that an owl may have also been inhabiting the tree we were focussing on. Laura then showed the children how to create their own clay insects and how natural materials can add texture and shape.

The second activity was led by Martin and focussed on using natural inks to tell our own stories and those of the trees in the park. The children started by representing their own lives using the circles of a tree and noted down any key events in their lives. To make these circles, they used a range of materials, such as; chalk, flint, charcoal, ink and some more adventurous boys used nettles. They then imagined themselves as the trees in Petworth Park and created a timeline spanning from 1066 to the present day, using the ink to handwrite sentences onto planks of wood.

The day culminated in the work being collected together for an exhibition which will be held at Petworth Park in the near future. The children and adults had a fantastic, if slightly cold, day and are very grateful to the charity and Petworth Park for allowing us to visit.

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Running Through the Streets of Chichester

On Wednesday 26th February eight year five and six children participated in the annual Chichester Cooperate Challenge where the children compete against other schools and running clubs over a distance of 1400m, through the streets of Chichester. The races did not start until 6.30pm, which added to the atmosphere. This was the first race evening of three, so it is a large commitment from the children to take part.

Our year six boys' team were first (Oliver D, Jack R, Hendricks, Lloyd and Charlie G) and as expected running down North Street was like a sprint. The children did two laps of the circuit and our boys finished:

Lloyd 18th 5min 26sec; Charlie G 46th 5min 48sec; Jack R 54th 5min 56sec; Oliver D 75th 6min 19sec; Hendricks 76th 6min Children can come dressed as their favourite book character to 21sec (out of 99 boys). Overall the team finished in 20th place out of 50.

Our year six girls were next and we only had two (Everlyn and Mae). Again, it was a frantic start but both girls were near the front throughout the race. Everlyn finished 10th 5min 38sec and Mae finished 13th 5min 50sec (out of 83 girls).

Harry R was our only year five representative and he ran steadily throughout. As he paced himself, he overtook the children who started off too guickly. Harry finished 47th (out of 84 runners) in 6min 10sec.

The challenge to the children now is to try and beat their time on Wednesday 11th March and then again on Wednesday 25th March. Once again, I am so proud of how our children competed and wanted to do their best. I am looking forward to the next race.
