Headteacher for the Day

On Monday 9th January Miss Williams became our Headteacher for the day after her letter was chosen by our governors. Miss Williams had a packed day, which included welcoming children to school, a staff meeting, meeting with our Premises Manager and Office Manager, led whole school Collective Worship, break duties, lunch in staff room, taught Elm Class and of course eating cake.



TAG Rugby at the Weald

Our hardy tag rugby team braved the cold and ventured to the Weald Community School in Billingshurst to compete in a tag rugby tournament on Wednesday afternoon. Our squad was a mix of children who have played club rugby and others who were fairly new to the sport.

The fixtures with the six other teams were announced and it turned out we had some extra time to 'warm-up' as we were not playing in the first set of games.

Barns Green were our first opponents (who had already played their first match) and it took us a few minutes before the children realised running backwards to avoid getting tagged was not the best tactic! Lesson learnt, we lost 10-5 but with a much better sense of how to win the next fixtures. Sure enough, we then went on to beat Billingshurst B (20 - 0), Plaistow (15-0), Shipley (20 - 15) and draw with Billingshurst A (5-5). Our team were delighted with a superb set of results and more importantly, the sense that we were performing really well as a team. Almost every member of our squad scored a try! When the results were announced, we were told that we were joint 1st place with Barns Green. Unfortunately, the presence of all those primary school teachers meant that the organisers' scores were scrupulously checked and it transpired that we had actually come second overall. A fantastic, but slightly bittersweet result for our team!





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Athletes

On Friday 20th January, we took eight athletes to participate in the annual MRC Quad Athletics event. Each child would attempt the standing long jump, 600m run, vortex throw and a 75m sprint.

Our first event was the standing long jump and we had some very good attempts. Our jumps ranged from 1m 20cm to 1m 85cm.

The 600m 'jog' was next. Each school ran separately, which meant our team were chasing Shay all of the way round. Again, some good times and it was great to see that the children try so hard to get their fastest time. I especially liked their sprint finishes. It was also lovely to have a couple of minutes of quiet after their run!

Next was the vortex throw. Once again we had a range of distances, with our best approximately 27m.

The final event was the 75m sprint, and it was great to see our children try so hard to get their best times. Lots of smiles as they finished.

With no results until the MRC Sports Leaders have collated all of the data, the event was a sporting success. Another opportunity for our children to compete against other schools and experience different sports. However, I think we will replicate this as one of our intra sports events later on in the year to let all of our children challenge each other.

A big thank you to the MRC Sports Leaders, who were responsible for measuring the distances and timing the events. Well done!

Our children really enjoyed the experience and were still buzzing when we arrived back at Pulborough train station at 11.40pm.


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
